Learning to Dance

I've told the story before of Marcia and me taking dance lessons at the VFW in Soldier, Iowa. The two of us were on either side of 30-years-old, and we thought it would be fun to have a weekly night out dancing. Well, *Marcia* thought it would be fun to have a weekly night out



dancing. I went along with it. Truthfully, it took effort on my part. You see, I can feel clumsy and awkward on the dance floor, and everything within me just wants to "sit this one out" rather than giving my body, mind, and heart the practice to come together in learning new steps of motion.

So, Immanuel, here we are again learning a new dance - life together amidst COVID-19 and many other societal challenges. This is all new to me, too. Now, I may have missed the class in seminary that covered ministry during pandemics. Perhaps it had been talked about in one of those wonderful hypotheticals that seminarians love to throw at their professors, but I don't remember such a conversation. What we are experiencing and working through may not be new to world history, but it is new to us. We are learning new steps, including our return to weekly in-person worship.




Case in point: Celebrating Holy Communion while maintaining physical distance from one's dance partners through the disconnect of masks, space and even time, to name a few. And, yes, the possibility of COVID-19 wanting to join the dance, as well! Not only are we learning our new steps, we're also trying to choreograph them as we go. In our return to in-person corporate worship, we're experimenting with com-

muning in our pews (or at home via our online worship live stream or recording), first making sure that everyone has bread and wine where they're seated *and then* hearing the life-giving words of Jesus' promise that he joins with ordinary earthly bread and wine, giving unto us a heavenly meal saying, "This *is* my body for you. This *is* my blood for you." My hope is that these new steps share Gospel gift while addressing various COVID challenges, yet as we actually do the steps we may discover that adjustments are needed due to pandemic practicalities or conveyance of unintended teachings. (On this last point, I'm very aware that *how we do* the sacraments can sometimes teach louder than *what we say* about the sacraments.) I invite both your patience and perspectives.

Life together amidst COVID-19. Shall we just sit this one out? No way! Let's be bold to join the dance, whether in-person or from home, yet humble in knowing that we've got new (and old) steps to learn (and re-learn). What's more, back in Soldier, Iowa, dec-

ades ago amidst awkward steps, I finally looked up to see the sparkling, joyful, loving eyes of the one who held me close in the dance. Yes, it's OK to glance at your feet now and again, but let's not forget to look up into the eyes of the One who dances with us, even



leads us in the dance – our Lord Jesus Christ. He's got us! He's got this time! Let's follow *His* lead. *Lord Jesus, lead on! Amen.* Your brother in Christ, **Pastor Steve**

Throughout the week, while some small group gatherings may resume meeting in-person, others may meet online via the video/audio conferencing tool Zoom. This continues to evolve.

If you need to stay at home and are not online, please call Pastor Steve for options, including receiving a DVD or CD of services. Other options may also become available.

"Put simply, *The Chosen* is one of the most engaging Bibleinspired productions I've seen," wrote one critic, and I must agree. I believe *The Chosen* is even a first – a crowdfunded, mini-series depiction of Jesus' live and ministry as shared in the gospels. "I am very concerned about pollution and climate change and see my response to all of that as part of my Christian life," he said. Besides his witness at Immanuel, Kevin also works with the Marquette Climate Lobby to advocate for a cleaner environment.

"Jesus died on the cross to save us," Kevin says to us. "And we can respond to that grace by being responsible and making the world we have a better place."


