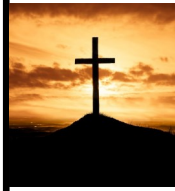
as we see the good in people, we see the positive in every situation, even though it may be difficult at the time. Our focus becomes on what is best for the community.

Council Corner – April Updates

Bishop Finegan met with council at the April council meeting. She presented the name of Pastor Breanne Kinnunen (Pastor Bre) as a candidate for Immanuel's fulltime pastor. Council reviewed Pastor Bre's personal ministry statement. We are joyfully looking ahead to continue the call process with Pastor Bre.

More good news shared is that our building loan will be paid off with the final payment being made at the end of April. We are planning a mortgage burning celebration on Sunday, June 11, 2023. More info to come.

Immanuel is planning to have a float in this year's Pioneer Week parade. We have formed a small committee of: Linda Sjolund, Walter Scanlon, Ben and Kitty Raymond to get things planned out and organized. We are looking for others to get involved. Please contact anyone of the members if you would like to be involved with this year's float.

Following up after the approval at this year's annual meeting, council has authorized the property committee to proceed working with the vender to install the platform wheelchair lift. It is expected that once the contract is signed and a down deposit made that completion time frame would be 8-12 weeks.

Immanuel plans to upgrade our outside sign. We are in the early stages of looking into this. Other updates received were: status of our A.E.D. that is on order through a grant, our upcoming companion synod Sunday, and updating Immanuel's website. Various committee reports were received.

CALL COMMITTEE UPDATE

Call Committee Update

On Tuesday 4/18/23 Bishop Katherine Finegan met with the church council / Call committee regarding a Pastoral candidate

that is very interested in a call to Immanuel. That candidate is **Pastor Breanne Kinnunen**. Pastor Bre, as we have referred to her over the past year, has stepped down from her quarter time interim pastor position with Immanuel, as she is now our fulltime pastoral candidate. In the meantime, **Pastor Bruce Thorsen** was assigned to be our Administrative Interim Pastor. His role will be to cover pastoral emergencies, such as hospitalizations and funerals. He will also be arranging pulpit supply to lead worship through July.

Now, back to Pastor Breanne Kinnunen. The church council / call committee was very pleased to hear that Pastor Bre has expressed interest in Immanuel as a permanent full-time call

We as a church will be following the call process steps required for calling a new pastor. Here is the schedule:

- **Monday May 8th** - the call committee will be doing a formal interview with Pastor Bre.
- **Saturday May 13th** - there will be a "Meet and Greet" reception in our fellowship hall to meet Pastor Bre and talk with her from 2:00 pm - 3:30 pm. Refreshments will be served.
- **Sunday May 14th** - (Mother's Day) and on **Monday May 15th**, Pastor Bre will be leading worship and giving the sermon.
- **Tuesday May 16th** - the call committee will vote whether or not to recommend Pastor Bre to the congregation. If the call committee recommends Pastor Bre to the congregation, then a congregational meeting will be called for.
- **Sunday June 4th** - for a congregational vote to call Pastor Bre to Immanuel. A vote in favor of calling Pastor Bre to Immanuel would need to be vote of 2/3rds or better. If Pastor Bre was called by the congregational vote to be Immanuel's next Pastor, then on . . .
- **Tuesday August 1st** - Pastor Bre would start as our permanent full-time pastor.

The call committee encourages you to be in prayer for Pastor Bre and the call process. In all things we are striving to seek God's will for both Immanuel and for Pastor Bre.

HOME ACCESS TO WORSHIP

In each case, please let the church office know if you would like to pick up or receive a communion packet (pre-packaged grape juice & bread wafer) for communing with the gathered congregation via tech connections:

- 1) View the live stream of worship each Sunday at 9:30 am. You can access this via our church website with the "Worship At Home" page. You may also connect via Immanuel's Facebook page or our YouTube channel.
- 2) View the recorded version of Sunday's worship later in the day (or beyond) on our church website or via our YouTube channel.
- 3) Contact the church office if you're interested in participating in our new **Tablet Ministry**. Using Amazon FIRE tablets, the recorded worship video is uploaded onto the tablet which, in turn, is delivered to you. People who have used this so far have been greatly blessed. Special thank you to Sue Cathcart and Luanne Skrenes for coordinating this ministry.

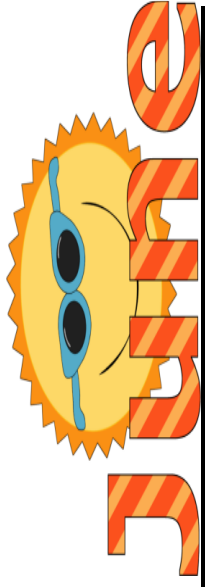

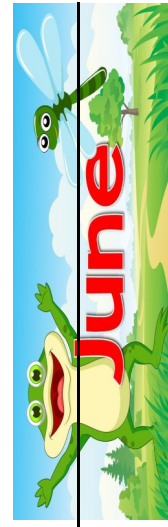

Women's Call to Serve God

Since the beginnings of the Lutheran Church in America in the 1800s, women have been engaged in missions and ministry, even before they had a voice in the



church. Our current women's organization, WELCA, was formed in 1987 from three predecessor groups from the church bodies that had merged to form the

Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. Membership in WELCA, or Women of the ELCA, is enjoyed by **all women** in our ELCA congregations. Many congregations have women's groups at the church level, but they are invited to participate in and support WELCA as member units of our Synodical Women's Organizations. Congregational Units are organized into clusters corresponding to our synodical conferences, and each synod has a Synodical Women's Organization. WELCA is separately incorporated and is not an auxiliary of the church. It is financially independent and responsible for its own financial affairs. Financial support comes from individual and group offerings and gifts.

I am providing this background information to help congregational women understand that their participation in and support of our Synodical Women's Organization is critical to its survival and success. The Northern Great Lakes Synodical Women's Organization is seeing a marked decline in participation by congregational units and women. Many congregations' women's groups or ministries have elected to withdraw their support from the SWO. Regional clusters are having trouble identifying leadership at the cluster level, and the SWO Board is having difficulties with filling vacancies for board members who serve as cluster liaisons and officers. When clusters fail to hold their Spring and Fall Gatherings, we see a drop in funding for the SWO as well as churchwide WELCA.

WELCA and the SWO offer many resources for the spiritual development of women, leadership development, missions projects and ideas, and opportunities for fellowship. WELCA provides many online resources, including Bible studies, retreat programs, Zoom events, models for organizing congregational units for mission, and podcasts. WELCA's magazine—*Gather*—offers



monthly Bible studies and inspirational articles. WELCA also offers a variety of scholarships for Lutheran laywomen providing assistance to women studying for careers other than ordained ministry.

The SWO gatherings provide learning opportunities through leadership development, community building, stewardship education, networks for communication and opportunities for joint ministry and action with the guidance of the SWO. The SWO also holds an annual convention and weekend retreat for the entire synod. The SWO has had a history of global missions, including quilting, personal care kits, clothing, and support of the Mkusa Girls' School in Tanzania.

Faith

Our congregations' failure to participate in and support the SWO is critically weakening our ability to support women's ministries in our synod. We are weakening the relationships between our congregations and our ability to work on joint projects. Our congregations need to encourage women to take advantage of opportunities to grow in discipleship and leadership. *"Christ himself gave the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, the pastors and teachers, to equip his people for works of service, so that the body of Christ may be built up" (Ephesians 4:11-12).* Women need to identify their spiritual gifts and use them for service in God's Kingdom. The SWO can provide options.

The SWO also needs volunteers to serve in leadership positions at the cluster level, and on the SWO Board to help with planning, outreach,



and special projects. The Lord is saying, *"Whom shall I send, and who will go for us?"* Our women need to examine their hearts to see if the Holy Spirit is prompting them to respond, *"Here I am! Send me."* We are each called to *"fear the Lord and serve him faithfully with all your heart. For consider what great things he has done for you" (1 Samuel 12:24).* Your sister in Christ,

Shining with the Light of Christ in the Northern Great Lakes Synod

“For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven.” ~Ecclesiastes 3:1

Dear Northern Great Lakes Synod,

What time is it?

In our Synod Office, we have two clocks on the conference room wall, one set to Eastern Time and the other to Central Time. Between the two clocks is the above verse.

I find this to be a helpful reminder, not only that our Synod spans two time zones, but that all things have their time. And God’s time, or rather God’s timing, plays a part in what our time will hold.

So what time is it for you? In your life? In your congregation’s life? In the life of the Church? In the context of our changing culture and world?

As I look back on the times of my family, we are now past the season of small children and the rhythm of school activities, events, and sports. I am glad for the time we spent watching games, choir concerts, piano lessons, and so much more. I’m both sad and relieved that I don’t have to sit on the bleachers in a windy blizzard anymore, trying to distinguish the boy and the ball on a gridiron covered with falling snow. These seasons of life pass, and while we’re glad to have had them, we know that time does not stand still. We expect that there will be different seasons in a lifetime.

It is more difficult, I think, to witness the end of a season that has spanned generations. When a congregation closes, it is easy to feel not only deep grief, but a sense of failure, that somehow the current generation has not done what is necessary. But what if that community of faith has accomplished all that was needful in its season? No congregation that was founded by the apostles in the first century is still in existence. Those communities of faith served for a time, the time that was given to them. And they accomplished what was needful for their time, planting seeds of future churches and future faith.

For everything there is a season; for people, for churches, for institutions. I grieved along with you at the announcement that Finlandia University will begin to end. The impact on the community, the blow to its economy, to its sense of self and pride, can hardly be estimated. It is a huge loss.

And yet, I find it helpful to put this loss within the context of Ecclesiastes. For Finlandia, its season is over, along with hundreds of other small colleges and universities that also will close because they cannot withstand the challenges and realities of our time. This is not the result of some failure or lack of creative strategy or dedicated effort.

This simply is. Finlandia’s season is completed. And what remains is to end with grace and gratitude for all that was accomplished during its time. We celebrate the vision of its founders, the education excellence, the nurturing of character and integrity of so many students, the dedication of faculty, staff, management, coaches, and more.



No one and no thing lasts forever; not people, not congregations, not institutions. Kingdoms and nations rise and fall. Indeed, it is when something has existed for generations that we expect it to outlive us also. But this generation may well witness the end of many things

whose seasons will be complete during our time.

Consider the rotary dial phone, the 35 mm film camera and the end of Kodak, the manual typewriter, cassette tapes, and the whole polyester fashion debacle of the 1970’s. These things that were so essential to their time are not only obsolete now, but they only exist in antique shops, thrift stores, and dusty garage boxes.

By the grace of God, our ministry efforts of the past, and those that will end in our time, will plant seeds for future churches and future faith. The assets of one whose season is ending will provide new life for one whose season continues for future ministry. The work of Christ and God’s purposes are far bigger than any single person, congregation, or institution. God in Christ Jesus is in the business of new life, and has a particular flair for new life after death. As the season of ministry ends for beloved efforts, traditions, congregations and institutions, God brings new life, new energy, new possibilities, new opportunities.

So we contribute what we can, we participate as we are able, in the time that we have been given, to further the work of Christ that we know will continue long after we are gone.

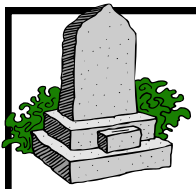

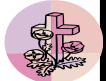

One Life

I've lived many places in my 63 years. I've met a lot of people. I've been a student, teacher, and pastor in several different communities. As I grow older, I reflect on those places and people. I sometimes go online to not only catch up on the local news but to also look at the obituaries to see if I recognize any familiar names. Sometimes I see a name that I vaguely recall and then read further.

Recently I came across a name and obituary that caught my attention. I won't share the name, but this person died at a very young age. Immediately when you see the young age of someone in an obituary, your mind starts to wander. What happened that someone so young died?

Below are some redacted excerpts from one of the most honest and profound obituaries that I have every read. It is an obituary of this person, this "One Life."

- "_____ lost her ongoing battle with addiction. It's impossible to capture a person in an obituary, especially someone whose life was largely defined by addiction.
• To some, _____ was just a "junkie" -when they saw her in addiction, they stopped seeing HER.
• _____ had a hard life - one that most people can't even imagine being real. She always tried to push forward and persevere. She made many good choices, but some bad ones too.
• In 2022 _____ relapsed. She was so disappointed in herself, and she thought all her hard work had gone to waste. Her last relapse is what ultimately took her from us.
• In honor of _____'s life, we ask that the truth be spread regarding this epidemic and awareness be raised. If you struggle with addiction and are reading this, please know that hundreds of thousands of families who have lost someone to this disease are rooting and praying for you. It is never too late. Let today be day one of the rest of your life. If you have a hard time understanding addicts, please educate yourself about this disease. It does not discriminate. They need us, they need our support. Let's stop the epidemic AND the stigma."



The obituary concluded with the Bible verse from 2 Corinthians 12:9: "My grace is sufficient for you, for My strength is made perfect in weakness."

Like me, I suspect that you could fill in the blanks above with the name of someone you lost because of an addiction. Thanks be to God that God sees all of us, even when we see only part of each other.

God never stops seeing us just as we are. May we have an attitude of humility and compassion for all those struggling with addiction. In the words of the obituary, "Let's stop the epidemic AND stigma." Pastor Jim Duehring, Assistant to the Bishop and Director for Evangelical Mission

BABY CARE KITS

- Two lightweight cotton t-shirts (no onesies)
- Two long or short-sleeved gowns or sleepers without feet
- Two receiving blankets, medium-weight cotton or flannel, or crocheted or knitted with lightweight yarn between 36" and 52" square
- Four cloth diapers, flat fold preferred
- One jacket, sweater or sweatshirt with a hood, *or include a baby hat*
- Two pairs of socks
- One hand towel, dark color recommended
- Two bath-size bars of gentle soap equaling 8-9 oz., in original wrapping (no mini or hotel size bars)
- Two diaper pins or large safety pins



QUILT & SEWING KITS

Quilts: Fabric (no knits of 100% polyester), Sheets & Pillowcases, Thread, Light weight blankets or flannel sheets.

Fabric Kits: Two spools of neutral-colored, general purpose thread 250-300 yards each; Two pieces of cotton or cotton-blend fabric (no knits of 100% polyester). Each piece should match one of the sizes below:

- 2 ¼ yards of 60" wide fabric
- 3 yards of 44" wide fabric
- 4 yards of 36" wide fabric

PERSONAL CARE KITS

- One light-weight bath-size towel (between 20"x40" & 52"x27") dark color recommended

- One sturdy drawstring backpack-style cloth bag, approximately 14" x 17"
