+COVID PROTOCOL UPDATE Immanuel's council, during their May 18th meeting, resolved to update our COVID-19 Protocol in the following points:

- Facemasks: Facemasks for vaccinated people are still encouraged. Facemasks are required for all wishing to sing worship songs. (We're still not ready to sing robustly.)
- Social Distancing and Lower Capacities:
 - Worship Space: 75 people maximum, sitting in staggered half-pews
 - Fellowship Hall: 100 people maximum
 - A hybrid combination of in-person and internet access will be used for many gatherings
- Coffee hour following Sunday worship will return
- Hymnbooks will be returned to the pew racks by June
- Bulletins will return by June, experimenting with a simpler format that works with projections

"Gospel Message" May 30, 2021 - Holy Trinity "Bring Your Questions"

Although Nicodemus comes to Jesus claiming to know that Jesus comes from God, it is clear from the remainder of the conversation that he has deep questions on his heart. And after all of Jesus' talk of being born of water and Spirit Nicodemus almost pleads: "How can these things be?" (John 3:9).

What questions do you bring to worship with you today? As we gather around the baptismal font, we do so with Luther's reminder that daily a new person is to come forth and rise up to live before God in righteousness and purity forever. (Evangelical Lutheran Worship, p. 1165) We too might ask, "How can these things be?" Does today feel like a new day of righteousness and purity? Does today feel any different than yesterday or the day before? Sometimes the answer is yes, but often it does not seem there is anything "new" about any g iven day.

Throughout the gospels we hear about people's responses to their encounters with Jesus. They go away healed and rejoicing, grieving or angry. We get no such exit with Nicodemus. Jesus speaks about God's love for the world and is soon on the move again. What happened to Nicodemus? He will reappear in the seventh chapter of John, defending Jesus as the leaders wonder why Jesus has not been arrested, and in the nineteenth chapter to help lay Jesus in the tomb. In both cases today's encounter with Jesus is remembered. It seems that Nicodemus's questions and his struggle to understand are the beginning of a slow reshaping of his life.

Bring your questions to the water today. Bring your questions again and again. Dip your hands in the water; mark yourself with the cross; know that the water and the Spirit will reshape you in ways you may

not understand today but will certainly remember in later chapters of life.
