"Gospel Message" 1st Sunday of Christmas Home for the Holidays

Did you celebrate Christmas at home this year? As Perry Como popularly sang, our culture tells us that "there's no place like home for the holidays." Yet, not everyone has a place that feels like home. While some people have lived in the same town or even in the same house for many decades, others have moved year after year, or find "home" to be unsafe or precarious. Still others have had to leave home behind under threat of violence, natural disaster, or political persecution.

Today, Matthew's gospel reminds us that Jesus' life was marked more by movement and displacement than by a settled existence. Even shortly after his birth, Jesus faced threats that caused his family to flee their home and country. Later in his life, Jesus warned an eager would-be follower about the risks of a life of discipleship, saying, "The Son of Man has nowhere to lay his head" (Matt.—8:20). But Jesus' goal was not to find home for himself; instead it was to become a resting place for those who struggle to find one in this world.

In this Christmas season, the story of Jesus proclaimed in Christian assemblies calls us to look around for those who feel unwelcome in this world. We are called to seek out those who have no home, or who have lost their home in physical or emotional ways. How is your community serving those without a home? Is there a homeless shelter in your community, a youth refuge, or an organization that assists refugees and asylum seekers? Led on by our God who often had no comfortable

resting place, the Christian community is called to witness to the home we experience in Christ's love by serving those who seek one.

DECEMBER'S MONTHLY MISSION

IN DECEMBER, our mission emphasis is, 'Room at the Inn: Caring for Our Homeless Neighbors'.

When Room at the Inn opened in 2007, there was a handful of guests housed in local churches, staffed by all volunteers. But as the years progressed, the number of homeless guests increased and it became apparent that our community needed a more permanent solution, a shelter



that did not require the guests to move to a different location every week, and a shelter that did not stress the space of many of the churches.

The Room at the Inn Board spent years looking for a space for a permanent housing for an emergency shelter. Meanwhile, our community learned a lot about homelessness. Many of our guests struggle with addictions, mental illness, brokenness, chronic poverty and homelessness. Moving our guests out of homelessness is not an easy fix. Guests need the security and the stability of a permanent "home" to have the strength to move forward. A couple of years ago the current director, Nick Emmendorfer, suggested using the Warming Center building, a building many guests view as home, as an emergency shelter.

The need to have a permanent place has become increasingly urgent with COVID, to be able to keep the guests in a central location to prevent the spread of COVID to guests and the community.

Immanuel's monthly mission in December is Room at the Inn. Messiah Lutheran is matching any funds up to \$20,000 given to the building project of Room at the Inn. The construction at the Warming Center building has started, converting the upstairs into a dormitory that will house 24 guests and converting the downstairs backroom into overflow and a space for guests unable to navigate the stairs.
